## End of Waste

With the EU Regulation (EU) No. 333/2011 of 31 March 2011, it can be determined that certain types of metal scrap are no longer considered waste in accordance with Directive 2008/98/EC of the European Parliament and the Council. This EU Regulation is European legislation and is in force throughout the entire European Union.

With a quality system in accordance with this regulation, the certificate holder declares, through a declaration of conformity, that products delivered under this certificate are no longer considered waste but as a raw material in a production process. To grant the End of Waste status to the scrap, the producer must have implemented a quality management system as stipulated in Article 6, demonstrating compliance with the criteria in Article 3 for iron and steel scrap and/or Article 4 for aluminum scrap.

By issuing this End of Waste certificate, Kiwa has determined in an initial audit that the certificate holder's quality management system meets the requirements of the EU Regulation and properly classifies the metal scrap.

During the validity of this End of Waste certificate, Kiwa annually assesses the certificate holder on:

- the requirements of EU Regulation 333/2011, including the annexes;
- whether the quality management system for End of Waste complies with the regulation;
- whether the material does not reach or exceed the threshold for hazardous properties according to Annex III of the Waste Framework Directive (WFD) 2008/98/EC. It is possible that hazardous substances listed in Annex III of Directive 2008/98/EC are present in the scrap. However, the content remains below the concentration limits from Annex III of the WFD;
- whether the material meets the percentage of foreign materials according to Regulation EU 333/2011;
- whether the radiation certificate is included with the shipment;
- whether the declaration of conformity contains the correct information and is included with the shipment.

Outside the scope of this certificate are:

- aspects of other National and International legislation;
- legislation and regulations regarding cross-border transport (e.g., Waste Shipment Regulation);
- the manner of supervision by the competent authority on the certificate holder;
- deviating or additional private law conditions set by the recipients of the End of Waste material on the metal scrap.
